Duration: 2 years (4 semesters) | Evaluation: Theory exams, Assignments, Field Studies, Dissertation

Course Structure

- Duration: 2 years (4 semesters).
- Each semester includes 4–5 core papers and electives.
- Credits: Typically 3–4 per paper.
- Evaluation: Written exams, internal assessments, field studies, and dissertation/project.
